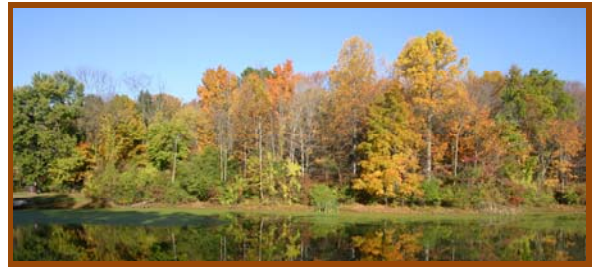

Rescue Committee Update

I'm writing this on July 22nd having just returned from a rescue transport trip. I was contacted by a shelter volunteer about a female with a pup in southern Indiana that might be Newfoundlands. Mike Wingfield went to the shelter and did a positive ID that she was a purebred. Mike, Heather Bacher and I transported her, and Susan and Virginia worked diligently to arrange transport and foster details. This black girl has been named Glenda in honor of the shelter volunteer, and her puppy is a happy girl who is a bundle of energy!

After a very busy year in 2008, the SCNC rescue committee began 2009 with a bang, with numerous calls and e-mails from people looking to re-home their dogs. Economic conditions continue to affect rescue. Details about our recent rescue effort are outlined below.

Max came from Wooster, OH and is being fostered by Pete and Amy Moller. Max is a special needs dog, as he desperately needed knee surgery for double cruciate ligament and luxated patellas. The Moller family is doing an excellent job in getting Max through his surgery and helping him in his rehabilitation. If you would like to make a donation to help fund Max's surgery, please see our website.

Montgomery was owner- surrendered, about 1 year old, and was fostered by Ken and Karen Dunaway. A very handsome boy who needed lots of attention, he found his adoptive home with Elizabeth Pritchard and her German Shepherd in Maryland.

Annie, a 3-year-old female, was fostered by Nancy Knox. Before coming to us she spent over a year in horrible conditions, and it took a toll on her. Despite all of Nancy's talent and best efforts, Annie's behavior became erratic and unpredictable, sadly, she had to be euthanized. Our sincere thanks to Nancy for taking on this girl and giving her the very best home possible and lots of love while trying to help her.

Dozer is a very good-looking guy who needed some help with manners and escape behaviors. Picked up and transported by Kathy and Mark Korona, then fostered by Amy Birk, he's been adopted by Dave Gregoire and Amy Robinson. Kudos to Amy and family for their work to turn Dozer into a gentleman!

Nana, a lovely brown 3-year-old girl, came into SCNC rescue due to her owner's severe illness and divorce. Greg and Floreen McKinley fostered her for a time, and now she is being fostered by Denise Ryder. We have had many inquiries on her, and she should be easy to place.

Bud came from the Dayton, OH shelter and is being fostered by Pete and Amy Moller. He's about 5 years old, and had us all thinking he might be deaf until we had his dirty ears cleaned at the Vets office. He is pending a home check to go to his forever home soon.

Annabelle is a special needs puppy that came from a shelter in Ohio. She is a purebred Newfoundland puppy that was turned into the shelter at the age of nine weeks, due to supposedly having Subaortic Stenosis. After Doppler, her initial diagnosis of Subaortic Stenosis has been changed to Pulmonic Stenosis. Amy Birk is fostering her, and is carefully observing her to monitor any changes in behavior and activity levels. Amy reports that she is a happy girl who acts like a normal puppy most of the time. We hope she can surmount her challenges and go on to the great life she deserves. She has a heart

Doppler recheck on Aug 4 to evaluate heart pressures.

Cusco (formerly Lovey) had been adopted from SCNC rescue, but was returned because of the new owner's changing job and financial status. She loves to chase squirrels and play with other dogs. The Dunaways are fostering her, and she is ready to go into a home.

Blackjack is an owner-surrender currently being fostered by Teri Pifer. She is getting to know him better so that she can recommend the best type of home for his personality. He is learning that he is a Newf and other dogs are a 'fun' playmate and nothing to be afraid of. So far, he is doing extremely well, works very hard to please and craves attention!

Bessie, a 13-year-old Landseer, and **Dallas**, an 11-year-old black female, came into rescue together as their owner was moving to Florida and couldn't take them along. Bessie is deaf and doesn't see well, but Dallas is amazingly healthy for a senior girl. Since they were "joined at the hip" we hoped to adopt them out together, and Donna Stahelin offered to give them a forever home. Bessie and Dallas enjoyed "rock star" treatment when they were flown from West Lafayette, Indiana to St. Charles, Illinois by airplane, at no cost to SCNC, by Kyler Laird of Laird Therapy Dog Rescue. Kyler is a pilot who has a soft spot for Newfoundlands and we are so grateful to him for his help.

Samson, a 5-year-old boy, was fostered by Ken and Karen Dunaway and adopted by Dave Thomson. We thank the Dunaways for their continued dedication to Newfoundlands in need.

Bear, a roughly 3-year-old boy who was owner surrendered in Dayton Oh is now with June Marksbury and family in Kentucky. He was originally a foster boy but now is staying with June as a forever family member as he learns that life doesn't have to be that hard.

SCNC has already placed 21 Newfs in 2009, after carefully checking references and doing home checks, sometimes with the help of Newfoundland owners in other states. Among them are **Teddy Bear**, fostered by Pete and Amy Moller and Donna Stahelin. She was adopted by

SCNC honorary members Dick and Shirley Mittendorf. They brought her to our Annual Meeting in February, and it is clear she is now a much loved member of their family. **Taylor**, fostered by Heather Bacher, was placed with Vern and Sharon Atkins. **Gertie**, fostered by Kathy and Ron Barnard, is a senior citizen who went to a great new home with Mary McDonald in Oklahoma. **Ben and Molly**, fostered by Nancy Knox and the Dunaways, was adopted by Amy and Chuck Heap and family in New York. Another **Molly**, who SCNC knew as *Shiloh*, was fostered by Leslie Harris and family and found her new home with SCNC member David Lawrence in Iowa, where she lives with two other Newfs, BOB (a former SCNC Rescue also adopted by Dave) and Emily Rose. **Simon**, who came from a very neglectful situation, was fostered by Ken and Karen Dunaway, and is now living with Alison Morelock and doing very well. **Rodney**, who we spent months working with a shelter in NW IN to release him, was fostered by Blair Animal Clinic, and was adopted by the Dan Cox family. **Diesel**, fostered by Gary Ryan, was a “foster failure” and has ended up living with Gary. Suzanne McMurchy and family fostered a brown Newf boy, who is now known as ‘Yogi,’ and was adopted by Jean Israel. Suzanne also fostered **Jake**, who was adopted by a friend of Suzanne’s and is doing wonderfully.

Deserving special mention is a little Gray and White boy. He came into rescue at the tender age of about nine weeks due to the breeder thinking he had eye issues. Melissa Stanton picked him up and gave him his first dose of SCNC rescue’s famous “tender loving care.” He was brought to the Hoosier Classic show in Indy, and, since it was Valentine’s Day, was promptly named “**Valentino**.” SCNC members at the show swooped down on the vendors’ booths and got lots of toys and supplies for “Tino.” Transported by Susan Kerby, he went to Debby Manning who spent countless hours socializing and teaching him to play with toys and interact with people more than dogs. She also worked to get him to walk on a leash instead of being carried everywhere. His visit to the canine ophthalmologist diagnosed him

as being totally blind with no treatment available. He is quick to learn and has a wonderful, happy personality. From there he went to Greg and Floreen McKinley. Tino recovered and has flourished under the wise care and tutoring of Greg and Floreen. They worked with him so that he would be a confident, happy boy despite the diagnosis of total blindness. He is in his forever home having a wonderful life with Art, Sharon and Katala Freas in Maryland. They saw the blessing of having such a special boy in their lives and opened their home to him. He is now named Kilrain and is inseparable from his new Newfie sister Katala, who was also adopted from SCNC Rescue last year. Kilrain shows what loving hearts and skilled foster care can do to bring out a bright future for a special needs dog.

In addition to the dogs listed above, SCNC rescue worked many other cases and cooperated with Michigan Newfoundland Rescue and the NCA. By working together across club boundaries, we can ensure the welfare of Newfoundlands in need. Our thanks to our foster homes, transporters, and home check people, and our adopters. All of you are a huge help to SCNC’s rescue program efforts. A four paw salute to you!

Newfoundlands in Literature

J. C. and I were recently sent a gift from an old friend—an original copy of “The Dog Crusoe and His Master” printed in London in 1869. Although quite fragile, you can still turn the pages without breaking them, and there are a couple of faded but lovely etched plate illustrations. The book is written by Michael Allen Ballantyne, who apparently knew quite a bit about Newfoundlands. Crusoe was the only surviving puppy of a litter of Newfoundlands.

The story is set in the Midwest and Plains states, which is described by the author as “those wild prairies which are watered by the great Missouri river—the Father of Waters—and his numerous tributaries. Here dwell the Pawnees, the Sioux, the Delawarers, the Crows, the Blackfeet, and many other tribes...”

In the illustrations, Crusoe is obviously a Landseer, if a somewhat small and scruffy one, who survives many perilous adventures and demonstrates his lifesaving skills in the following passage (p. 118).

At this moment there was a wild cry of terror heard a short distance away from them. Rushing forward, they observed an Indiana woman flying frantically down the river's bank towards the waterfall, a hundred yards above which an object was seen struggling in the water.

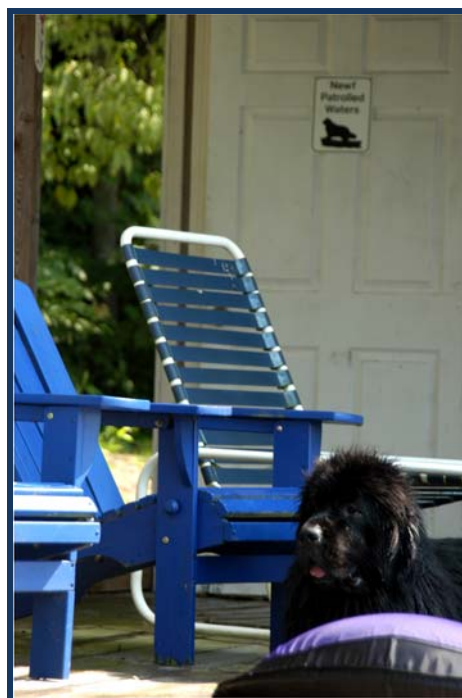
